Question Al Outputs

- Always verify Al-generated content for accuracy and relevance.
- Check for potential biases or misinformation.
- Remember: Al learns from data; its outputs reflect that data.





- Al is a tool to support your teaching goals.
- Use it to enrich learning experiences, not to automate core instruction.
- Ask: "How does this AI tool improve student outcomes or my teaching effectiveness?"



Responsible & Safe Use

- Prioritise student data privacy and confidentiality (GDPR/UK specific).
- Be mindful of safeguarding concerns (e.g., inappropriate content generation).
- Discuss AI ethics openly with students and colleagues.



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Actionable Strategies

- Explore AI for lesson planning, resource creation, or differentiation.
- Look for real-world examples and case studies from other educators.
- Start small, experiment, and share your findings.

- Identify repetitive tasks AI can automate (e.g., report writing drafts, quiz generation).
- Use AI to free up time for personalized student interaction.
- Learn shortcuts and effective prompting techniques.
